

TPL ships steel vessels to Jubail

Belgium-based Transport and Project Logistics (TPL) in May shipped five out-of-gauge inox steel vessels, and several loose 40 ft containers from Antwerp to Al Jubail, Saudi Arabia, as part of an ammonia scrubber installation being handled through members of the World Project Group (WPG).

The 3015 cu m shipment, which was delivered from the factory to Antwerp by ballasted barges, included three vessels of 7,750 mm diameter. All vessels had a capacity of 350 to 725 cu m.

TPL, part of WPG, is overseeing the project, which includes cargoes from Germany, Italy and India, using a single point of entry in Antwerp.

WPG is an independent Group of Project Freight Forwarders, including 30 companies active in 75 countries, and providing handling, packing, logistic schemes and cross-trade to the oil and gas, power generation, and mining and

construction industries worldwide.

TPL, which will mark its tenth anniversary next year, also designs, manufactures and distributes patent cases for project packing called Readybox.
